JEFFERSON COUNTY, ALABAMA 2008 Annual Plan Substantial Amendment Neighborhood Stabilization Program



This Action Plan Substantial Amendment is intended to work in the context of the Consolidated Plan and 2008 Annual Plan. However, in light of the specific additional funding authorities contained in the Housing Economic Recovery Act (HERA) while the provisions here are intended to be consistent with existing Plans, the more specific provisions in this Substantial Amendment shall take precedence over any language in the Consolidated Plan and 2008 Annual Plan, with the limitation that this Substantial Amendment refers only to Neighborhood Stabilization Program (NSP) funding.

The Jefferson County Consortium is made up of the unincorporated areas of Jefferson County, Alabama and 30 municipalities within the County. The Cities of Birmingham, Bessemer and Hoover, County Line, West Jefferson, Argo and Sumiton are the only cities in the County not participating in the Consortium. Birmingham, Bessemer and Hoover are entitlement cities themselves.

Proposed 2008 Substantial Amendment/Budget

The Jefferson County Commission, through its Office of Community Development ("JCC-OCD") will use funds to purchase and rehabilitate homes and residential properties that have been abandoned or foreclosed upon in order to sell, rent or redevelop such homes and properties. JCC-OCD may allow the use of other federal or local government loan, grant, guarantee, tax credit or tax-exempt bond or rent subsidy programs which do not conflict with NSP rules and regulations.

All NSP funds allocated to JCC-OCD, will be used in this manner shown below:
