"Don't Drop it on Alabama" PALS Spring Cleanup

This Spring Cleanup targets roadside litter that will easily fit into the bags provided. Target areas include common areas throughout neighborhoods and communities; roadways and creek banks; and roadside ditches and storm drains.

Alabama PALS (People Against a Littered State):

PALS is a statewide non-profit 501(c)(3) organization whose mission is working with Alabama communities to promote a cleaner and healthier Alabama. PALS assists cities, counties, schools and communities by providing programs that address litter prevention, cleanup and litter control.

Sponsors:

Event Information:

Volunteer Litter Roadside Cleanup materials are available any time during the year, January through December. It is recommended that residents meet at a central location before heading to the project area so that they can: register, pick up materials, and learn the designated location(s) for placing the filled bags. Event flyers can be created upon request and promoted through various social media outlets and websites.

Materials:

Free trash bags and media kits can be provided to qualifying communities/organizations that are interested in participating in our Volunteer Litter Roadside Cleanup Program. Each community will select a coordinator who will be responsible for picking up materials, and reporting results. Jefferson County Stormwater Program (JCSWP) coordinates PALS Cleanups with local communities and organizations in Jefferson County. A few weeks prior to the cleanup, materials can be picked up from the JCSWP office located at the Jefferson County Courthouse, Room A-200 716 Richard Arrington Jr. Blvd., N., 35203. Results Reporting:

On the completion of the event, the **Community Coordinators will need to submit** the following information to the Jefferson County Stormwater Program, Roads & Transportation Department:

- Volunteer sign in sheet
- Areas that were cleaned up (roadways and community areas)
- Digital photographs (registration table, volunteers, bags of litter)
- Number of bags collected / tonnage
